BEEF CATTLE YOUTH CHALLENGE

The Competition will be conducted under the following Q.C.A.S. rules –

- 1 Open to persons under the age of 25 years at 1st April 2024.
- 2 Competitors under 18 years must have approval of parent or guardian to compete and it is the responsibility of a parent or guardian to make arrangements on behalf of the competitor.
- 3 All competitors to be a resident in Queensland for at least three months prior to the competition or be attending a college in Queensland. Entrants residing over the border who can prove an affinity with a Queensland Show are allowed entry by satisfying one of the following criteria:
 - (a) Their address has a Queensland postcode.
 - (b) They have a Queensland phone number.
 - (c) The entrant or the entrant's parents are active working members of that show.
- 4 National winners and judges are not eligible.
- 5 A Competitor can represent only one show society in any sub-chamber final and only one sub-chamber in the state final.

Beef Cattle Young Paraders' Sub-Chamber Final will be held in 2024.
