SCHOOL, KINDERGARTEN AND EARLY EDUCATION CARE CENTRE DISPLAYS

This section provides secondary schools, primary schools, kindergartens, early education centres and home schoolers in our area with an opportunity to display the work of their students. There is no set theme. No entry fee is required. Entries will be judged on the variety and standard of student work; imaginative use of the space and general overall impression created by the display. Schools are encouraged to also consider an interactive element in their displays (that is, interactive with the people viewing the display.)

To assist in planning displays, each entrant will have an area 2.4m X 2.4m which is surrounded by wire mesh sides that are 1.8m high. The wire mesh is covered with hessian. There is a security screen attached to the front of each display area and a table is provided. Student work can be attached to the hessian, displayed on the table and on the floor space in front of the table. You will need to provide a cover for the table and any other tables/screens/display units. Each entrant is to provide a banner for their display which identifies their school.

Please advise the Chief Steward before the end of May to confirm your space for a display and to advise if you need access to power.

A perpetual trophy for first prize, award cards and prize money will be presented to schools gaining 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places. Kindergarten and Early Education Centres will also be awarded 1st and 2nd prizes and prize money, with a trophy for 1st place. Show visitors will also be able to vote for a People's Choice Award.

STUDENT SCHOOL WORK - INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES

All individual entries are to be the original work of the student and must be produced at school (or at home in the case of home school students). No entry fee is required, but for identification purposes details of name, age, year, school and

class of entry must be written clearly on the top left corner on the back of the exhibit, if possible (or attached to craft work).

Only one entry per student per class is allowed. Topics / themes / mediums have been left to the discretion of individual teachers and schools to suit their curriculum. Individual entries must be in the hands of the Chief Steward by 4pm on Thursday, for judging on Friday. Individual entries may be brought in when school displays are set up in the last week of school term. Award cards will be given by judges for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places. No prize money will be awarded for individual entries.


